

Announcing Editor's Prizes for Best Articles in the Inaugural Year of the Journal of Eating Disorders

The *Journal of Eating Disorders (JoED*), in association with Ramsay Mental Health, announce <u>two</u> <u>prizes</u>, each of \$A1,500, for meritorious articles that have been accepted for publication during 2012 and up to 30 June 2013. Articles will be assessed also for findings that are likely to have broad (global) impact in reducing the community and personal burden of eating disorders.

Prize winners will be notified in August 2013 and will be announced during the Editors meeting in Bethesda, Maryland, in September 2013.

Prize 1: Best Article Advancing the Field of Eating Disorders

- a. The winner of this prize will be the first author of a manuscript accepted for publication in JoED in 2012 up to 30 June 2013
- b. There is no process for application but the prize winner must not meet criteria (b) for Prize 2 below.

Prize 2: Best Article by a Younger Author

- a. The author must have submitted and had accepted for publication as first author a full manuscript research paper or systematic review to JoED in 2012 up to 30 June 2013
- b. The author must be early in their scientific publishing career as evidenced by fewer than 10 SCOPUS and/or PUBMED listed publications as at 30 June 2013.

Selection Committee and Adjudicators are the Editors-in-Chief and Associate Editors of *Journal of Eating Disorders*. Where a member of the Selection Committee is an author or co-author of a manuscript under consideration the member will declare this and not return a score on the relevant manuscript.

JoED and Ramsay Mental Health

This is a benevolent activity by Ramsay Mental Health to support publications and dissemination of research in the area of eating disorders. There is no ongoing commitment to provide these prizes beyond the inaugural year. The prize will be administered by the Managing Editor of JoED, Mr Jeremy Freeman, and is a cash prize directly paid from Ramsay Mental Health to the recipient.
